

Little Havens Children's Hospice

Little Havens provides specialist care and support for babies, children and young people living with complex or incurable conditions, from Essex and the surrounding boroughs. They offer care and support for each child or young person, and their whole family, in their homes and at their hospice in Rayleigh, Essex.

Key offerings:

- 'Day Stay' sessions, for respite, to give a child a change of scene
- Comfortable, free accommodaton for family members
- Overnight respite breaks an important chance to give parents and carers tme to rest and recuperate
- Specialist care for children and young people approaching the end of their life, and for their families, including a private bereavement suite where families can stay when their child has died, and bereavement counselling



Smile of Hope connection

Steve and Sandra have had a relatonship with the Hospice since 2004. Their close friends Rob and Sarah DeCristofano had a daughter Lili diagnosed as terminally ill from the age of two, who sadly passed away in 2024.

The couples decided to set up an event in 2005 to raise funds for the Hospice. It was called 'I'm a banker get me outta here' and ran for 9 years raising over £1.1million. The couples were honoured with a highly commended award in the Pride of Essex awards.

In 2012 Lili's Smile (fore-runner to Smile of Hope) was set up in order to help families of the Hospice.

Child Heart Foundation

In order to assist infants with heart abnormalities born into financially disadvantaged households, the CHILD HEART FOUNDATION (CHF) was formed as a trust in Delhi in 2013.

Dr. Vikas Kohli, a paediatric cardiologist, and seven parents who had experienced similar circumstances with their children and wanted to help the less fortunate families, after observing and personally experiencing the challenges faced by underprivileged families with a child born with a heart condition.

Their primary goal is to address all elements of congenital heart problems in children, including paediatric echocardiographic screening, diagnosis, and treatment, as well as raising awareness, sharing knowledge, educating physicians, and advocating.

Steve was travelling on business to India and was introduced to CHF by a business acquaintance who fund raised for them. He had a chance to visit their hospital and meet some of the kids who needed surgery. He was so impressed by Vikas and his team, he vowed to help them as much as he could.

Jen Up

Jenny Tomei is passionate about educating and empowering those who are at risk of developing an eating disorder. Which applies to many more young people today than most of us realise.

Over the past year, the rise in mental health issues has resulted in an explosion of the number of those with different eating disorders such as; anorexia, orthorexia or pica.

Having recovered from anorexia herself and since training as a Nutritional Therapist and Eating Disorder Coach, Jenny knows what is needed is a more personal, holistic, and balanced approach. One that combines education, group work and peer support. This ensures young people are far better equipped to take back control of their lives.

Steve initially hired Jenny as his personal trainer several years ago. Having become friends, they found they had a common interest in helping kids. Jenny started to educate Steve about the dangers of eating disorders and sparked an interest in him and fellow trustees.



Smile of Hope support

In 2024 Smile of Hope funded Jen Up with:

- 5-week online course for students on body image, nutrition, and early intervention of eating disorders
- 10-weeks 1-1 counselling for a school child
- 14 school workshops and 10-weeks 1-1 counselling for four school children



In 2025

- Two workshops for SEN children
- 10-weeks 1-1 counselling for a school SEN child
